The provision meets requirements

- Management and staff know how to provide a range of resources and fun activities to interest children and which complement their day at school.
- Management and staff have addressed the actions and recommendations raised at the previous inspection. All staff now hold a paediatric first-aid qualification and all records and documentation are available on site for inspection. The manager has updated the safeguarding procedure and hygiene procedures are improved.
- Management and staff understand their responsibility to keep children safe. They have clear procedures to follow if they have a concern about a child's well-being.
- Management and staff understand the importance of working in partnership with parents and schools to share information and ensure a consistent approach.
- Management and staff know how to reflect on, and evaluate, what they do to identify areas for development and make ongoing improvements.
- Management and staff understand the importance of teaching children how to keep themselves safe and healthy. They know how to promote good behaviour.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Keinton Kids registered in 2006. It operates from Keinton Mandeville Primary School in Somerset. The club opens Monday to Friday during school term times from 7.45am to 8.30am and from 3pm to 6pm. The owner/manager has an early years qualification at level 3. She employs three members of staff; one has an early years qualification at level 3. The staff are qualified teaching assistants at the school. There were no children on roll in the early years age range when this inspection took place.
