## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder provides an interesting and welcoming indoor and outdoor play environment. There is a wide range of resources accessible to children.
- The childminder has a good understanding of how to safeguard children. She recognises the signs and symptoms that may indicate a concern about a child's welfare and knows the procedure to follow. The childminder completes risk assessments of her home to ensure it is safe and suitable.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's learning. She knows how to assess their development and plan a variety of activities to help them progress.
- The childminder understands the importance of providing children with healthy food and ensuring they are active outdoors each day. She understands how to meet children's individual needs to help them feel emotionally secure and to support their moves to new settings.
- The childminder works closely with her assistant and is well motivated. They regularly evaluate their practice, taking into account the views of the parents and children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector looked at relevant documentation, including policies, contracts and accident forms.
- The inspector spoke with the childminder about her arrangements to care for children in the early years age range.
- The inspector looked at the suitability of the environment, and the toys and equipment available for use with children.

She offers care from 7am to 9am and 3.15pm to 7pm term time and also provides holiday cover. At the time of inspection there were no children present in the early years age range.
