The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not hold a current paediatric first-aid qualification, as required. This breach also relates to the requirements of the Childcare Register.
- The childminder understands how to safeguard children and to keep up to date with any relevant changes in legislation. She knows what procedures to follow if she has concerns about a child's safety and welfare.
- The childminder has a safe and welcoming environment. She knows how children learn and develop, and to plan a range of activities across all areas of learning. She knows how to monitor children's progress and identify their next steps in learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of promoting healthy lifestyles, for example, through good hygiene practices, offering healthy meals and regular exercise.
- The childminder understands the value of working in partnership with parents, to share information and to promote consistency in children's learning and care.
- The childminder understands how to evaluate her setting and take account of the view of others in improving her provision.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
