The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has an understanding of safeguarding and child protection. She is clear of her responsibility to provide children with a safe and secure environment.
- The childminder understands the importance of planning activities to promote children's learning and development. She is aware of her role to assess and monitor children's progress to help children move onto the next stage in their development.
- The childminder is aware of her role to help children to understand the needs of others. She recognises her role to teach children to share and take turns in their play to help them develop positive relationships.
- The childminder has a variety of play equipment. She knows the importance of arranging the resources so children can select what to play with independently.
- The childminder is aware to work with the parents to provide continuity for the children's care and development.
- The childminder recognises the importance of continuing to evaluate her childminding provision to help her develop her practice.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation.
