Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder is self-evaluative and demonstrates the capacity to maintain ongoing improvements to her provision. Since the last inspection, she has improved the facilities available to children and has further developed the partnerships in place with other professionals.
- The childminder demonstrates her awareness and understanding of what to do if she has concerns over a child's welfare. She has completed safeguarding training and is aware of signs and symptoms of abuse. The childminder has a safeguarding policy in place and is aware of all new legislation to support her practice.
- The childminder demonstrates a clear knowledge and understanding of how she will promote the learning and development of young children. She describes how she will use her observations to assess and plan for children's development and monitor their progress through tracking.
- The childminder has a range of resources and play materials suitable for all ages of children. The childminder is aware of presenting resources in a way that makes them accessible to children.
- The childminder understands the importance of fostering children's personal development so that they develop respect and consideration for others. She explains how she will prepare children for their next stage in learning, such as nursery or school.
- The childminder discusses the importance of working closely with parents and the impact this will have on children's care and development. She describes the range of information that she will share and how she will encourage parents to contribute what they know about their child.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes and evaluate her practice.
- The inspector looked at a selection of the records, policies and procedures the childminder intends to use when caring for early years children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her knowledge of safeguarding.
- The inspector viewed the premises and the resources available for children.

The childminder was registered in 2009 and lives in New Moston, Manchester. She operates all year round from 7am to 6pm, Monday to Friday, except for bank holidays and family holidays. The childminder holds a relevant early years qualification at level 3.
