## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage to enable her to meet the needs of all the children. She has addressed the previous actions and recommendations to improve the quality of care and education she offers children.
- The childminder understands the importance of implementing robust safeguarding procedures to enable her to keep children safe. She knows how to identify possible signs of harm and how to refer these to the relevant agencies within prescribed timescales.
- The childminder understands the importance of engaging with parents, so that they contribute to their child's learning, share information and know about their child's progress.
- The childminder knows how to support children's learning and outcomes by providing effective learning opportunities. She understands how to observe children's abilities on entry, identify any gaps in their development and plan for their future progress.
- The childminder keeps her home free from possible risks to children at all times. She understands the importance of teaching children how to stay safe.
- The childminder increases her childcare knowledge by keeping up to date with changes and using the worldwide web to research childcare practices.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector looked at rooms used for childminding and the outdoor play area.
- The inspector looked at a selection of policies and procedures and records.
