# Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The management of the club is aware of how to safeguard children, for example, by ensuring all staff and committee members complete relevant checks. Staff attend child protection training and keep up-to-date with safeguarding procedures.
- Staff understand the need to work closely with teachers and parents to help meet children's individual care needs and build on skills and knowledge they learn in school.
- Staff create a welcoming and safe environment and provide a wide variety of activities and resources for children to choose from, including arts and crafts.
- Staff understand how to promote children's health and well-being. For example, staff provide outdoor games and activities that help develop children's physical skills.
- Staff know how to teach children to be respectful and kind to others.
- Since the previous inspection, staff have developed a clearer understanding of how to use daily routines, such as snack times, to help promote children's independence.
- The manager is aware of the value of gaining feedback from parents and children to help evaluate and improve practices.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector looked at the areas the club uses.
- The inspector discussed childcare practices with the provider.
- The inspector sampled relevant documentation the provider uses.
- The inspector discussed with the provider how they deliver the safeguarding and welfare requirements.

Cranbrook Primary Out of School Club registered in 2005. It operates from a building in the grounds of Cranbrook Primary School in Cranbrook, Kent. In school term times, the club operates from 7.45am to 8.45am and 3.15pm to 6pm on Monday to Friday. The holiday club operates from 7.45am to 6pm on Monday to Fridays, during all school holidays, depending on demand. The club employs three staff. All of the staff, including the manager, hold appropriate qualifications. There were no children present in the early years age range at the time of this inspection.
