Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to prepare children for the next stage in their learning. She explains how she will help children gain independence and confidence in becoming ready for school.
- The childminder has a sound knowledge and understanding of child protection procedures. She clearly knows her responsibility to protect the welfare of children in her care.
- The childminder clearly demonstrates her understanding of how children learn. She explains how she will help children progress in their learning by using information she will gather through observations.
- Through discussion, the childminder demonstrates how she will work closely with parents to ensure children's individual needs are fully met.
- The childminder clearly describes how she will promote healthy lifestyles. Children will be offered daily opportunities to be outside to promote their physical development, and snacks and meals will be nutritious.
- The childminder has addressed the actions and recommendations raised at the last inspection. She has developed her understanding of identifying challenging activities for children to address gaps in their learning. This demonstrates the childminder's capacity to improve her practice.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had in-depth discussions with the childminder. These related to her knowledge and understanding of the requirements for safeguarding and welfare and learning and development.
- The inspector observed areas of the home used when caring for children.
- The inspector looked at suitability checks, policies, procedures and documents the childminder uses when caring for children.
