Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The provider has a very good knowledge and understanding of how to provide the children with an interesting and exciting range of activities that complements and supports their learning in school.
- The provider has good systems in place to promote children's safety and welfare. She ensures that risk assessments of the premises are carried out each day, so that the building is kept secure to promote children's safety.
- The provider gathers valuable information from parents and teachers, in order to be able to support the children's individual care and learning needs throughout their time at the club.
- The provider understands how to promote children's well-being. She shows a good awareness of how to help children build positive relationships with others, make choices and be independent.
- The provider and her staff have a secure knowledge of child protection procedures and understand their responsibility to protect the welfare of the children in their care. They continue to update their safeguarding training.
- The provider has met the actions and recommendations set at the last inspection. The provider has worked to improve systems for supervision, performance management, quality of teaching and partnerships with parents and teachers. This demonstrates the provider's capacity for continual improvement.
- Parents and teachers report that they are very pleased with the service and support provided to the children and the level of information shared by the staff.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the premises and viewed all areas that are used by the children.
- The inspector discussed with the provider how she supports children's play and learning.
- The inspector looked at policies, procedures and other documentation the provider uses to record details of the children in her care.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability and qualifications of the staff. She talked with the provider about her self-evaluation and improvement plans.
