Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to plan activities that help children learn, and to maintain assessments of their progress. She has a varied range of toys and resources to meet the differing ages and abilities of the children.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's behaviour, and help them become emotionally and socially ready for their move to school.
- The childminder understands the importance of helping children to adopt healthy lifestyles by, for example, providing daily exercise and nutritious food.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to safeguard children and to report any child protection concerns. She conducts regular risk assessments of her home and resources to help ensure children remain safe and secure.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's understanding of the similarities and differences between people in the community and wider world.
- The childminder recognises the importance of evaluating her service. She understands the importance of developing her knowledge to improve outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her knowledge of the early years foundation stage requirements.
- The inspector viewed all areas of the home to be used for childminding.
