- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals, to support a consistent approach to meeting children's needs.
- The childminder knows how to help children to respect and value other people. For example, she plans to teach them about peoples' similarities and differences.
- The childminder knows how to support children to lead a healthy lifestyle. For example, she plans to take children to the park for fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder understands how to use self-evaluation to reflect on her practice. She knows the importance of developing her skills and knowledge, such as through training.

There were no children present when this inspection took place.
