Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The provider and staff understand their safeguarding responsibilities. They keep up-to-date with current safeguarding practice, such as through training, and know the procedure to follow if they have concerns about a child's welfare.
- The provider knows how to plan a range of activities and a variety of resources are available for children's play. She recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and schools to complement children's experiences outside of the setting.
- Staff are aware of how to help children understand behaviour expectations. They know how to support children's independence and individual choices.
- The provider and staff understand the importance of supporting children's good health and well-being. For example, they plan to provide children with regular opportunities to play outside and be active.
- The provider and staff understand how to reflect on their practice and know the importance of taking account of the views of parents and children. They have worked hard to address the actions and recommendations set at their last inspection. For example, a number of staff now hold current first-aid qualifications.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke with the provider about how she organises the setting.
- The inspector sampled documentation for the setting, including staff qualification certificates, children's records, and policies.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises used for the care of children.
- The inspector reviewed the club's self-evaluation.
- The inspector viewed the resources available for children.

Orca Kids Club is privately owned and registered in 2001. The setting operates from Nailsea Secondary School, North Somerset. It is open from 8am and 6pm during school holiday times, except for Christmas. The after-school club opens from 3pm to 6pm, term time only. Staff collect children from Grove Nursery and Primary School, St. Francis RC Primary School, Golden Valley School and Kings Hill School. There are 12 members of staff currently employed to work with the children. Of these, seven hold relevant qualifications, including one with qualified teacher status. There were no early years children on roll at the time of the inspection.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
