Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands child protection issues and the procedures to follow, including the need to keep thorough records of and to report any concerns.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals. She recognises the benefits this could have on children's care.
- The childminder understands the importance of teaching children about similarities and differences between themselves and others, including how to manage their feelings.
- The childminder knows how to plan a range of activities, so children have fun as they learn. She knows how to assess the progress children make from their starting points.
- The childminder knows how to monitor the childcare service she provides. She looks for ways in keeping her childcare knowledge up to date, such as through further training and improving the resources she provides.
- The childminder maintains her paediatric first-aid training. She is aware of how this can help her to respond to any minor accidents and emergencies, such as when caring for children in the home and while on outings.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector sampled documentation that the childminder intends to use to support her work.
- The inspector spoke to the childminder about her methods of assessing and planning for children's progress and development.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her processes for self-evaluation.
- The inspector looked at the rooms and the resources available for childminding purposes.

The childminder registered in 2014. She lives in the London Borough of Westminster. The childminder works each weekday and operates throughout most of the year. At the time of the inspection, there were no children on roll in early years age range.
