Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to keep children safe. She follows the procedures to safeguard children's welfare. This includes her child protection and home safety policy.
- The childminder recognises the importance of providing appropriate learning opportunities to meet children's individual needs. She has a suitable range of toys and resources and understands how to plan activities to support children's progress.
- The childminder understands the importance of working with parents and external agencies and services to meet children's individual needs and future learning.
- The childminder recognises the importance of helping children to understand their own and others' behaviour and its consequences.
- The childminder understands how to support children's healthy lifestyles. She understands the need to provide children with healthy food choices and daily opportunities to exercise outside.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of reviewing the service she provides. She attends mandatory training and keeps up to date with changes to help her improve.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder her safeguarding procedures and how she carries out risk assessments of her home.
- The inspector looked at policies and documents the childminder will use when caring for children.
- The inspector observed the areas used for the care of children along with furniture, equipment and toys that are used for childminding.
- The inspector looked at the childminder's qualifications and checked evidence of the suitability of adults in the home.
