Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The manager has a secure knowledge and understanding of how to provide the children with an interesting and exciting range of activities. This promotes their learning and development across the seven areas of learning.
- The provider and manager have good systems in place to promote children's safety and welfare. They ensure that risk assessments of the premises are carried out each day so that the nursery is secure and care arrangements promote children's well-being.
- The provider and manager are clear about the required child-to-staff ratios for the ages of the children cared for. They demonstrate how they deploy staff around the playrooms to ensure there is good supervision of children so they can play and learn in safety.
- The manager explains that each child is allocated a key person who gathers valuable information from parents. This enables them to support children's individual care and learning needs throughout their time at nursery.
- The manager understands how to promote children's well-being. She shows a good awareness of how to help children build positive relationships with others, make choices and be independent.
- The provider and manager ensure the staff team has a secure knowledge of child protection procedures. They understand their responsibilities to protect the welfare of the children in their care. All staff continue to update their safeguarding knowledge through training.
- The manager is a reflective practitioner. She works closely with the local authority and is introducing new systems to address any areas for improvement identified in the self-evaluation document. This demonstrates the capacity for continual improvement.
- The provider and manager build close working relationships with parents. Staff provide parents with detailed information and documentation, such as the nursery's policies and procedures.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the premises and viewed all areas that are used by the children.
- The inspector discussed with the provider and manager how they support children's play and learning.
- The inspector looked at policies, procedures and other documentation the provider uses to record details of the children.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability and qualifications of the staff and talked to the manager about self-evaluation and their ongoing plans for improvement.

Phoenix Day Nursery was registered in 2015. The nursery employs seven members of childcare staff. Of these, all hold appropriate early years qualifications at level 2 and above. The nursery opens from Monday to Friday all year round. Sessions are from 8am until 6pm. The nursery provides funded early education for two-, three- and four-year-old children.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
