## Summary of key findings for parents

#### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how children learn and develop. She knows how to support children to make progress and gain skills they will need for future learning.
- The childminder knows the importance of working in partnership with parents, professionals and other providers. She recognises that sharing information about children's progress will help to ensure consistency in their care and learning.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to safeguard children. She knows what actions to take if she is concerned about a child to protect their welfare.
- The childminder continues to develop her skills and increase her knowledge, for example, through training opportunities. She will evaluate her practice and look for ways to improve outcomes for children.
- The childminder knows the importance of teaching children to understand her expectations for their behaviour, and to learn to have respect for others.
- The childminder explained how she would contribute to children's good health, support their physical and emotional well-being and teach them how to keep themselves safe.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
