## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision does not meet requirements

- The manager does not ensure parents and visitors are fully aware of the safeguarding policy regarding mobile phones in the club, to ensure children's safety.
- The manager does not implement effective methods to support staff with their continuous professional development and develop their practice further.
- The manager and staff know how to provide a range of different activities and play opportunities to keep children interested and occupied. There is an appropriate range of toys and equipment to suit children's individual needs and backgrounds.
- The manager and staff know what to do if they are concerned about a child's welfare. In general, they understand how to support children to be safe and healthy, encourage positive behaviour and help them to respect and value others.
- The manager implements some methods for monitoring the provision, which take account of parents' and children's views. She has made some progress since the last inspection, such as ensuring there are enough staff with first-aid training.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage the provider must:

Harnham After-School Club registered in 2011. It operates from Harnham on the outskirts of Salisbury in Wiltshire. The club is open each weekday during term time from 3.05pm to 6pm, and during some school holidays, dependent on need. The club employs six staff. The manager and deputy hold a level 3 qualification in play work and two staff hold a level 2 qualification.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
