## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The provider understands the importance of working in partnership with parents, professionals and school staff to help support continuity in children's care and learning.
- The manager has appropriate procedures in place to help settle in children who are new to the setting. She understands how to provide regular opportunities for children to play outside and to help support their physical development.
- The manager and staff have a positive approach to managing children's behaviour, such as involving children in developing rules, and helping them learn to share and take turns during play.
- The provider has appropriate arrangements in place to seek the views of staff, parents and children in evaluating the quality of the provision. She has developed procedures to monitor staff performance and to support their professional development.
- The provider ensures all staff are suitable to work with children. The manager understands her responsibilities to safeguard children and to report any concerns about a child's welfare, to keep them safe from the risk of harm.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed areas available for children's use, including outdoors.
- The inspector viewed a sample of documentation, including the policies and procedures at the setting.
- The inspector held discussions with the provider and manager to assess their understanding of meeting the statutory requirements.
- The inspector discussed with the provider how she works in partnership with parents and school staff.
- The inspector reviewed the provider's self-evaluation process.
