## Summary of key findings for parents

#### The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not met all the actions from her previous inspection. She is in breach of requirements for the early years foundation stage and Childcare Register.
- The childminder does not have a written safeguarding or complaints policy, as required for the Childcare Register. She lacks understanding of how to manage any complaints made and the procedures to follow.
- The childminder has not kept up-to-date with changes in safeguarding legislation. She does not know how to respond in the event of an allegation being made against her nor has a procedure for the safe use of cameras and mobile phones in her setting.
- The childminder has failed to inform Ofsted of changes to members of her household over the age of 16, as required.
- The childminder has a range of resources to support children's learning and development. She understands the importance of planning activities to meet children's individual needs, and to help prepare them for the next stage in their learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of teaching children about healthy lifestyles, and managing their behaviour.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

# What the setting needs to do to improve further

To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:
