# Summary of key findings for parents

## The provision meets requirements

- The club leaders are well qualified, knowledgeable and experienced early years practitioners. They understand how to provide a stimulating play environment for all children. Recruitment systems, induction procedures and supervision sessions are in place.
- Staff demonstrate a commitment to working in partnerships with parents, the school and other professionals. They recognise the importance of valuing and celebrating the uniqueness of every child.
- Staff explain how they support children when they start at the club. They have developed communication systems with class teachers.
- Staff demonstrate a good understanding of their role in safeguarding children, including what to do if they have concerns about a child's welfare. Club practice is underpinned by a wide range of club policies.
- Leaders plan for future developments and seek the views of staff, the school, children and parents as part of their continuous improvement practice. Written feedback from parents states how much they value the club and staff flexibility.
- Staff understand the importance of helping children to live healthy lifestyles. Children are provided with nutritious and balanced snacks, and regular exercise and fresh air.
- Children have access to good quality resources, toys, tools and equipment.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

#### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector viewed the areas of the building used by the club.
- The inspector spoke to the club and school staff during the inspection.
- The inspector discussed the arrangements for safeguarding and how children at the club are kept safe.
- The inspector viewed a range of documents, including policies and procedures, risk assessments, children's records, qualifications and suitability checks.
- The inspector took into account written feedback from parents.

School's Out Club was registered in 2015 and is privately owned. The club employs four members of childcare staff who all hold appropriate early years qualifications, including two staff who hold qualified teacher status. The club opens on a Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, term time only. Sessions are from 7.50am until 9am and from 3.15pm until 5.45pm.
