## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The provider and staff understand their responsibilities to keep children safe. They know how to supervise children when walking between the schools and the club, and how to assist children to follow consistent safety rules and promote positive behaviour.
- The provider and staff have a secure knowledge of how to keep children safe, including what they would do if they have a concern about a child to protect their welfare.
- The provider has systems to support staff's professional development. For instance, staff benefit from regular coaching, mentoring and training opportunities that help them enhance their knowledge and be consistent in their professional practice.
- The provider is committed to continually improve the setting. She has procedures to obtain the views of the staff, parents and children to identify, and work on, priorities for improvement.
- The provider recognises the importance of an effective key-person system to work in partnership with parents and other professionals and offer consistency in children's care. Staff know how to provide a range of play activities to support each child well.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector walked with, and observed, staff collecting children from school.
- The inspector viewed the areas used by the children at the out-of-school club.
- The inspector discussed the provider's understanding of the requirements of the early years foundation stage.
- The inspector sampled the club's documentation, including various records such as those relating to safeguarding.

Kidszone registered in 2015. It is located in Morden, Surrey. The out-of-school club operates from 3.30pm to 6pm, during term time only. There are eight members of staff; the manager holds an appropriate qualification at level 4, four staff hold appropriate play work and childcare qualifications, three staff at level 2, and one at level 3. Staff collect children from five local schools. There were no children present in the early years age range at the time of the inspection.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
