Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has adequate knowledge of the learning and development requirements and understands how to plan activities linked to the children's needs.
- The childminder discusses how she gains information from parents in order to identify children's starting points. She states that she communicates with parents daily and shows an understanding of the importance of working in partnership with them to support children's learning and development.
- The childminder provides a welcoming environment with a range of accessible resources. She demonstrates, through discussion, how she takes account of the children's interests and their current learning in school in order to plan engaging activities.
- The childminder has knowledge of child protection issues and understands the procedures to follow in order to protect and safeguard children.
- The childminder's policies and practice help to show how she will ensure the safety and welfare of the children. For example, through daily risk assessments and checks of the environment.
- The childminder recognises the need to promote a healthy lifestyle for children. For example, she discusses how she will encourage daily outdoor play and provide fruit as part of a daily snack.
- The childminder shows an awareness of providing an inclusive environment. She demonstrates how she will help children develop their personal and social skills and build positive relationships. She has an understanding of how to promote positive behaviour and encourage respect for others.
- The childminder shows a commitment to providing a safe and caring environment. She demonstrates a clear understanding of how she can improve her knowledge and practice through further training.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the premises and viewed all areas that are used when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to support children's play and development.
- The inspector looked at policies, procedures and documents the childminder will use when caring for children.
