Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has improved her understanding of the requirements of her role. For example, she understands how to complete thorough checks to ensure her home and the toys and equipment are safe and suitable for the children she looks after.
- The childminder understands how to work with parents to find out about children's skills and interests to help her plan suitable activities and assess their progress. She understands how to prepare children for their future learning and the move to school.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to safeguard children. She knows what steps to take if she is concerned about a child's welfare.
- The childminder knows how to help children settle in her care and how to teach children about the benefits of a healthy lifestyle and about acceptable behaviour.
- The childminder knows how to keep her skills up-to-date and the importance of evaluating her provision and making improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the learning and development, and the safeguarding and welfare requirements of the early years foundation stage.
- The inspector spoke with the childminder about her understanding of safeguarding, child protection and first aid.
- The inspector viewed the parts of the childminder's home that she plans to use for childminding.
- The inspector sampled documentation, including the childminder's policies and children's records.

The childminder registered in 2011 and lives in Aylesbury, Buckinghamshire. She offers care all day, Monday to Friday, throughout the year. At the time of the inspection, there were no children on roll in the early years age range.
