Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The manager understands how to evaluate the provision and how to make use of feedback from others, in order to improve children's experiences continuously.
- The manager and staff have knowledge of child protection, and they know the procedures to follow to safeguard and protect children.
- The manager knows how to implement a thorough recruitment and vetting process. She understands staff supervision, support and development benefit the children.
- The manager and staff understand the importance of working with parents and other providers that children attend, to share essential information.
- The manager and staff understand how to provide a wide range of resources and activities of interest to the children, in order to motivate and engage them.
- The manager and staff know how to support children's personal development, health and physical well-being. They know how to encourage positive behaviour and how to set boundaries to teach children right from wrong.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the manager and staff how they intend to provide activities and experiences that support children's needs and interests.
- The inspector reviewed the setting's policies and other required documents, which the manager intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the manager her processes for self-evaluation and improvement plan.

Bubblegum After School Club Ltd registered in 2013. The provision operates from the Harris Academy Coleraine Park Primary School. It is situated in Tottenham, within the London Borough of Haringey. The provision offers after-school sessions each weekday from 3.30pm to 6pm, during term time only. They also offer play schemes during school holidays, from 8am to 6pm. The provision has nine staff; of these, five hold early years qualifications. At the time of the inspection, there were no early years children on roll.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.
