Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a clear understanding of his responsibilities to safeguard children. This includes the procedures to follow should he be concerned about a child's welfare.
- The childminder knows how to recruit, monitor and vet his staff, to support them in their role and ensure their ongoing suitability to work with children.
- The childminder understands the benefit of evaluating and reflecting on the quality of his setting, to continually make improvements.
- The childminder recognises the importance of building effective partnerships with parents and professionals, to provide consistency in children's experiences and learning.
- The childminder understands how to plan for, observe and assess children's development and monitor their overall learning, to help them make the best possible progress, in preparation for school.
- The childminder understands how to enhance children's emotional and physical well-being, and teach them how to take turns and respect one another. The learning environment is safe, welcoming and suitably resourced for children of different ages.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector spoke to the childminder about his practices and procedures, including how he intends to deliver the educational programmes for children.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises that are available for childminding and discussed safety arrangements.
- The inspector looked at samples of documentation and records that the childminder plans to use to support children's welfare and learning.
- The inspector held discussions the childminder about his systems for self-evaluation.
- The inspector spoke to the childminder's assistant during the inspection.
