## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has knowledge of safeguarding and understands her role to protect children. She is aware of the procedures to report any concerns to the relevant authorities.
- The childminder knows how to provide a wide range of opportunities for children to enjoy. She understands how children learn and how to help them make good progress.
- The childminder is aware of how to support children's behaviour. She plans to teach children how to be kind and caring, and to respect each other.
- The childminder is aware of how to promote children's well-being. For example, this will include providing healthy meals and opportunities for children to be physically active outdoors.
- The childminder understands how to evaluate her practice to help her recognise and make improvements to her service.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnerships with parents to share key information about the children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
