## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to safeguard children and protect them from harm. She knows the importance of keeping thorough records of any concerns and the procedures to follow to report these to the appropriate agencies.
- The childminder keeps her paediatric first-aid qualification up to date. She is aware of how this helps her to respond to children's minor accidents and emergencies.
- The childminder knows how to evaluate the service she offers. She seeks ways to improve her knowledge and skills, such as through training, to keep up to date with changes in childcare practice.
- The childminder knows how to identify children's abilities when they start with her. She understands how to use resources and plan activities to help children make progress.
- The childminder is aware of the need to work with parents. She recognises the importance of gathering and sharing information to understand children's needs and promote continuity of care.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector sampled documentation that the childminder intends to use to support her work.
- The inspector spoke to the childminder about her methods of assessing and planning for children's progress and development.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her processes for self-evaluation.
