## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not have a valid paediatric first-aid qualification, as required. This is also a breach of the Childcare Register.
- The childminder knows how to plan for children's progress and development and to help them move on to their next stages of learning.
- The childminder understands how to work in partnership with parents to support children's progress and achievements.
- The childminder is familiar with ways to support children's emotional development, such as teaching children to be kind, gentle and considerate towards others.
- The childminder is knowledgeable about different ways to keep children safe, such as completing risk assessments and obtaining parents' permissions for outings.
- The childminder is aware of how to identify and report potential concerns about children's safety, including wider safeguarding concerns, such as extreme views.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of her strengths and weaknesses and makes plans for improvement, such as having booked on to a relevant first aid course.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## What the setting needs to do to improve further

**To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:**

- obtain and maintain an appropriate paediatric-first aid qualification. 31/12/2016

## Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about how she organises her setting and plans for children's learning and development.
- The inspector sampled a range of documents, including the childminder's safeguarding policy.
- The inspector toured parts of the home available for childminding purposes.

The childminder registered in 2002 and lives in Yeovil, Somerset. She offers care every weekday from 7am to 6pm, all year round. There were no children in the early years age group on roll at the time of the inspection.
