## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her role in protecting the children's welfare and knows the safeguarding procedures to follow should she be concerned about a child.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents. She knows to provide parents with regular feedback about children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of ongoing professional development. For example, she carries out reading to maintain her professional knowledge and keeps up to date with changes.
- The childminder understands how to use observation and assessment of children's learning to plan activities to encourage their development and ongoing progress.
- The childminder knows how to prepare children for the next stages in their learning and their move on to school or nursery. For example, she understands the importance of promoting their independence and personal care skills.
- The childminder understands her role in helping children build strong relationships. For example, she plans to teach children to share, take turns and to respect each other.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
