## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to implement the learning and development requirements. She has an assessment process to enable her to identify, and plan for, children's individual learning and progress.
- The childminder knows how to identify that a child may be at risk of harm and what to do if she has concerns. She keeps her safeguarding knowledge up to date. For example, she regularly renews her safeguarding and first-aid training to support children's well-being.
- The childminder understands the importance of helping children learn about, and respect, other people. She has resources to prompt discussions with children about behaving kindly and showing consideration for everyone as individuals.
- The childminder understands the importance of teaching children how to be healthy. She plans many activities to encourage them to be active.
- The childminder knows the value of partnership working to support children's care and development. She builds relationships with parents and other settings for a consistent approach.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector discussed the childminder's understanding of the learning and development, and the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the childminder's home she intends to use for childminding.
- The inspector looked at documentation, including evidence of suitability checks and training certificates.

The childminder registered in 1998 and lives in Littlehampton, West Sussex. The childminder works all day from Monday to Friday, throughout the year. No children were present during this inspection.
