Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to evaluate the provision and maintain her professional development to increase her knowledge and improve children's experiences.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge of safeguarding and child protection issues. She is aware of the procedures to follow should she have concern about children's welfare. She knows how to identify indicators of children being drawn into extreme behaviours and views.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnerships with parents and other providers of settings children's attend to help encourage continuity in their learning.
- The childminder knows how to support children's personal skills and encourage positive behaviour, such as choosing their own play and listening to others.
- The childminder understands how to observe and assess children's learning and identify their individual interests and needs. She knows how to plan for children's next steps in learning to help prepare them for their future learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to provide activities and experiences that support children's learning.
- The inspector looked at the childminder's policies and documents that she intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her processes for self-evaluation and her improvement plan.
- The inspector viewed resources and toured the areas of the childminder's home that she intends to use for children.

The childminder holds an early years qualification at level 3. The childminder works with another registered childminder.
