

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

On 3 November 2016, the provider notified Ofsted of an accident at the setting. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Early Years Foundation Stage safeguarding and welfare requirements to notify Ofsted of any serious accident or injury to a child while in their care, and of the action taken.

We conducted an unannounced visit to the setting. We looked into the information to establish if the provider was meeting the Early Years Foundation Stage safeguarding and welfare requirements. In particular, the requirements relating to accidents and injury, risk assessment and the supervision of children.

At the visit we conducted observations, viewed documentation and held discussions. We found that the provider had conducted further risk assessments following the accident and was no longer using a piece of equipment due to the potential risk. Staff deployment arrangements had also been improved. We were satisfied with the action taken by the provider to avoid a similar occurrence.

The provider remains registered with Ofsted

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
