- The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour, including teaching them how to work together and respect each other's views.
- The childminder is aware of how to safeguard children. She understands how to report any concerns regarding children's welfare to the relevant agencies.
- The childminder understands the importance of working with her assistants to maintain ratios in order to keep children safe.
- The childminder is aware of how to assess children's learning. She understands how to use this information to plan activities and to ensure children make good progress.
- The childminder understands the importance of reviewing and evaluating her practice and that of her assistants. She recognises the importance of working with other professionals and parents to meet children's individual needs.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The childminder registered in 2014. She lives in Swanley, Kent. She works between five to six days a week, from 7am to 7pm, 48 weeks of the year. The childminder also provides overnight care. She works with two assistants. At the time of the inspection no early years children were present.
