Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the procedures to follow should she have any safeguarding concerns about children's welfare. She has kept up to date with recent changes and knows how to identify any risk from extreme behaviour and views.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's good health and well-being. For example, she provides nutritious home-cooked food and promotes physical exercise.
- The childminder understands how to complete risk assessments to ensure her premises are safe for children. She knows how to manage children's behaviour by encouraging children to take turns, share and respect others.
- The childminder understands how to reflect on her practice and gather the views of parents and children to help make improvements. She uses a range of professional development opportunities to support and develop her practice.
- The childminder knows how to assess children's progress and plan activities to promote their next steps in learning. She understands the importance of establishing links with parents and other settings children attend to promote continuity in learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the premises and checked all areas available for childminding.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to work with parents and other professionals.
- The inspector spoke to the childminder about how she intends to continue to improve her services and develop her skills.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's arrangements for keeping children safe.
- The inspector looked at documentation and children's records.
