## Summary of key findings for parents

#### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has addressed the actions and recommendations from the last inspection. For example, she has an understanding of how to support children's learning and development needs. She knows how to use information taken from observations and assessments to identify the next steps in children's learning.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to safeguard children. She has a clear understanding of the procedures to follow should she have any concerns about a child's welfare.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and others involved in children's care, to provide a consistent approach to meeting their individual needs.
- The childminder understands the importance of reflective practice and keeping her knowledge and professional skills up to date.
- The childminder understands how to support positive behaviour. She understands the importance of building children's confidence and self-esteem.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

#### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector discussed with the childminder her knowledge and understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector looked at documents relating to evidence of the suitability of household members. She looked at and discussed policies and procedures used by the childminder in her practice.
- The inspector spoke to the childminder about how she intends to deliver the learning and development requirements for children.
- The inspector discussed self-evaluation and plans for improvement with the childminder.
- The inspector reviewed a variety of toys, resources and equipment available to meet the needs of children of all ages.
