The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has taken steps to address the recommendations raised at the last inspection. She demonstrates a capacity to improve and further develop the provision. She has increased the opportunities for encouraging the early writing skills of any children she may care for and understands how to support children's interest in books.
- The childminder demonstrates a clear knowledge and understanding of how to promote the learning and development of young children. She knows how to assess children's development and plan a variety of activities to help them progress.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's safety and welfare. She knows how to use risk assessment to reduce hazards and what she would do if she had concerns about a child's welfare. She understands how to help children learn about diversity, and to develop tolerance and acceptance of different beliefs and cultures.
- The childminder understands the importance of evaluating her practice and planning for development. She continues to keep up to date with the changes in guidance and legislation.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working closely with parents and other professionals, to ensure that children are well supported.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
