Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder is aware of the procedures to follow to safeguard children. She understands the importance of monitoring children's attendance and keeping up to date with new legislation.
- The childminder knows how to keep children safe. She understands the need to carry out risk assessments, such as when going on outings.
- The childminder knows how to teach the children about healthy lifestyles, such as through discussions about healthy snacks and regular exercise.
- The childminder understands how to use information from her observation and assessment of children's progress, to help plan for the next steps in their learning.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and external agencies to meet children's individual learning and care needs.
- The childminder seeks to enhance her knowledge and skills through further training. She understands the importance of evaluating her practice and seeking the views of parents and children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her knowledge of the early years foundation stage, including her understanding of the progress check for children aged between two and three years.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she plans to deliver the learning and development requirements.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her self-evaluation and improvement plans.
- The inspector looked at relevant records, and discussed the policies and documents that the childminder intends to use when caring for children, including those for safeguarding and working with parents.
