Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder is friendly and welcoming. She has a range of risk assessments in place to ensure safety is maintained within the home.
- The childminder shows the capacity to meet learning and development requirements. She knows how to assess children's progress and plan for their learning needs.
- The childminder shows a clear understanding of equality and diversity and how to develop children's understanding. She also has systems in place to ensure children who have special educational needs and/or disabilities or those who speak English as an additional language, are supported appropriately.
- The childminder shows a commitment to encouraging an inclusive service and working in partnership with parents through various methods of communication.
- The childminder knows how to ensure children are engaged in a broad range of activities that reflect the areas of learning. This includes free play, adult-led activities and outings to local places of interest.
- The childminder has devised a range of appropriate policies and procedures relating to safeguarding children and ensuring their care and welfare. She is knowledgeable of child protection and welfare procedures. She knows how to take prompt and appropriate action if she has any concerns regarding children's welfare.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector looked at the childminder's evidence of how she would use self-evaluation to improve her service.
- The inspector viewed areas of the home used for childminding.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she would meet the early years requirements.
- The inspector checked evidence of the childminder's qualifications and the suitability of any adults living on the premises.
- The inspector discussed how the childminder would observe and assess children's progress.
