The provision meets requirements

- The childminder is clear about her role in safeguarding children and understands her responsibility to protect their welfare. She knows who to speak to in the event of a concern.
- The childminder has systems in place to keep children safe by identifying and minimising risks in the home and on outings.
- The childminder provides a wide range of toys and resources to promote children's learning. She has a clear understanding of how to observe, assess and monitor children's progress to identify and plan for their next steps in learning.
- The childminder has a clear understanding of how to work in partnership with parents, other early years providers and local schools to benefit children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's well-being. She shows an awareness of how to help children build positive relationships with others, make choices and be independent. She understands how to manage children's behaviour positively and how to develop their understanding of others.
- The childminder knows how to promote children's understanding of a healthy lifestyle. This includes providing healthy meals and snacks and encouraging physical development through a range of activities.
- The childminder is aware of the need to evaluate her practice to help identify areas for improvement. She understands the importance of updating her skills and knowledge to help improve her provision and promote children's learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
