## Summary of key findings for parents

#### The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not hold a valid paediatric first-aid qualification, as required. This is also a breach to the requirements of the Childcare Register.
- The childminder knows how to observe, assess and track children's progress to help prepare them for the next stage in learning, including nursery and school.
- The childminder understands her role to protect children from harm. She is aware of the signs and symptoms that may indicate that a child is at risk of harm and she has procedures for reporting any safeguarding concerns.
- The childminder understands how partnership working with parents and other settings can help her to meet children's care and learning needs.
- The childminder offers a welcoming environment and has a wide range of resources and play materials to engage their interest. She is aware of how to support children's healthy lifestyles and their positive behaviour.
- The childminder recognises the need to evaluate her service and include the views of parents and children to help her provide good quality outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
