## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to identify and report any possible signs that may indicate a child's welfare being at risk of harm.
- The childminder understands learning and development requirements. She knows how to plan and provide learning experiences to support children to make progress in all areas of their development.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of establishing relationships with parents to meet the children's individual care and learning needs, and engage parents to share her observations and assessments undertaken.
- The childminder understands the need to evaluate her service and bring about improvements. She has met previous recommendations to improve children's learning opportunities and develop professional links with other settings children may attend.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder to assess her understanding of the requirements of the early years foundation stage.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her understanding of learning and development requirements, and the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector discussed the methods the childminder uses for self-evaluation.
- The inspector looked at the areas of the childminder's house, and a sample of play materials and equipment used for childminding purpose.
