This monitoring visit.

Ofsted completed an unannounced monitoring visit because of concerns around a child's well-being while in the care of a foster carer. The police and local authority are currently investigating the concerns and their investigations are ongoing. The foster carer does not have any children placed with her pending the outcome of the investigation. The agency have acted appropriately and engaged with professionals as part of the investigation.

Ofsted found two regulatory breaches from this monitoring visit. While the agency had completed a lengthy foster carer assessment for panel, they had not made all attempts to gather the relevant background information in order to provide a clear and in-depth assessment of the foster carer. Risk assessments did not give enough consideration as to the history and experiences of the foster carer and any potential impact on their role as a foster carer.

The agency has worked effectively with the local authority. The local authority has no concerns regarding the agency's actions. The agency has followed their own safeguarding procedures and has effectively shared information. The agency has reflected on their recruitment processes. They are waiting for the outcome from the local authority and police prior to being able to fully review the incident and future learnings.
