## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates a suitable knowledge of safeguarding procedures and how to safeguard children from harm.
- The childminder understands how to provide planned, purposeful play experiences, to progress children's learning and take account of their individual learning needs.
- The childminder knows how to improve her practice and is committed to continually developing her skills.
- The childminder holds a current paediatric first-aid certificate. She has an up-to-date knowledge of how she would deal with accidents and is aware of the need to maintain records for accidents and injuries.
- The childminder knows how to use appropriate behaviour management strategies, to encourage children to behave well.
- The childminder understands how to share information with parents and work together with other providers, to support children's learning and care needs.
- The environment is clean and resourced with a range of toys and equipment ready for any children that the childminder may care for in the future.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The childminder registered in 2013. She lives in Ruislip, Middlesex. The childminder offers care Monday to Friday, from 8am to 6pm. She works all year round, except for bank holidays. She has a childcare qualification at level 3. There were no children on roll in the early years age range at the time of this inspection.
