Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has good systems in place to promote children's safety and welfare. For example, she will evaluate potential risks in the premises and on outings to ensure that children are kept safe.
- The childminder has a good knowledge of how she will identify and report any safeguarding concerns. She recognises the need to support children's understanding of keeping themselves safe, such as teaching them about road safety.
- The childminder will access regular training to help keep her knowledge and skills updated. She recognises the need to consider the views of parents and children and reflect on the quality of her practice.
- The childminder discusses how she will help children make choices and be independent in readiness for school. She also understands how to promote positive behaviour.
- The childminder has a good understanding of child development and the different ways that children learn. She describes how she will provide a range of interesting activities to promote children's development across all areas of learning.
- The childminder explains how she will provide an inclusive service. She has procedures in place that she plans to use to monitor children's progress so that she can swiftly identify and address any gaps in learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of partnership working. She knows how she will establish two-way communication with parents and other providers to promote consistency in children's care and learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

■ The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programme for children and undertake assessment of their development.

- The inspector looked at documentation the childminder will use when caring for children and discussed self-evaluation and improvement plans.
- The inspector checked the evidence of suitability of the childminder and other members of her household.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements and the systems she has in place to keep children safe.
- The inspector viewed the areas where childminding will take place and had a discussion about the resources that the childminder will provide.
