## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements. She knows how to provide children with learning experiences across all areas of development and undertake the required assessments.
- The childminder understands how to complete observations to assess children's progress and use these to plan activities to meet their individual needs.
- The childminder understands her responsibility to address any safeguarding concerns and the need to report these to the appropriate agencies.
- The childminder knows how to use self-evaluation to improve the service she offers. She has met previous a recommendation to improve children's learning opportunities when playing outdoors.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnerships with parents and other professionals to support children's care and development.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder about her understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her understanding of the learning and development requirements.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her self-evaluation process.
- The inspector looked at a sample of documentation, including policies and procedures.
- The inspector looked at areas of the home used for minding purposes and a sample of play materials and equipment available for minded children.
