Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her role in keeping children safe. She recognises the signs that may indicate a child being at risk of harm and knows how to report any welfare concerns.
- The childminder understands how to support children's well-being. She knows how to help them become emotionally and developmentally ready for the next steps in their learning.
- The childminder understands how to provide a range of activities to support children's learning and development, and to help them make good progress.
- The childminder knows how to support children's physical well-being, such as through healthy eating and active play. She knows how to encourage children to behave well.
- The childminder recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals, to support children's individual needs.
- The childminder recognises the importance of evaluating her setting. She knows how to seek the views of others to help her reflect on her practice. She understands the importance of developing her knowledge to improve outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder to explore her understanding of the requirements for the early years foundation stage.
- The inspector viewed a sample of documentation the childminder intends to use, such as children's attendance records and procedures for administering medicine.
- The inspector spoke with the childminder about how she evaluates and improves her service.
- The inspector completed a tour of the premises.
