## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder knows how to evaluate her practice to identify areas to improve in readiness for her return to childminding. However, she has not kept her first-aid certificate up to date, as required. This is also a breach to the Childcare Register requirements.
- The childminder knows how to support children's welfare and learning needs. She recognises the need to establish positive relationships with parents and other early years providers to help children as they move between settings and on to school.
- The childminder understands how to assess children's progress. She has appropriate equipment and resources, and knows how to plan activities to support their learning and development needs.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of encouraging children to enjoy outdoor physical play, to develop healthy eating habits and follow effective hygiene procedures to support their good health.
- The childminder has completed child protection training and is confident to follow the local safeguarding procedures if she has any concerns about a child.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## What the setting needs to do to improve further

The childminder registered in 2012 and lives in Ponsonooth, in Cornwall. She provides care on weekdays, all year round. The childminder holds an early years foundation degree. There are currently no children in the early years age range on roll.
