## Summary of key findings for parents

#### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder is aware of potential hazards and knows how to reduce risks to children's safety. The childminder's home is free from hazards.
- The childminder understands child protection issues and the procedures to follow if she has any concerns about a child being at risk of harm. She also has an understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements to support children's health and well-being.
- The childminder understands how to use assessments to plan for children's learning and development, and provide play experiences to help children progress in all areas of learning.
- The childminder understands how to help children learn to behave responsibly and develop a positive attitude towards diversity.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents. She recognises the positive impact this could have on children's care and learning.
- The childminder has addressed previous recommendations. For example, she has attended training courses to develop her skills. She knows how to evaluate her practice to make improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
