Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a sound knowledge and understanding of the learning and development requirements of the early years foundation stage. She understands how to assess and monitor children's progress in order to ensure that they learn and develop appropriately.
- The childminder describes how she will provide a suitable range of activities and learning experiences to interest and engage children.
- The childminder recognises the value of partnerships with parents and other settings that children attend to help encourage continuity in care and learning. She identifies ways in which she plans to encourage parents to share information about children's needs, interests and achievements.
- The childminder is aware of how to promote children's well-being. For example, this includes providing healthy snacks and encouraging physical development through a range of activities and outings. She knows how to positively manage children's behaviour.
- The childminder and her staff have knowledge of child protection reporting procedures and understand their responsibility to protect the welfare of the children in their care. The childminder conducts regular risk assessments on her home and resources to help ensure children remain safe and secure.
- The childminder understands the value of continuous reflection on her practice to identify areas for further development. She recognises the need to continue to improve her skills and knowledge. She ensures that her mandatory training, such as paediatric first aid, is kept up to date.
- The childminder has effective systems in place for staff vetting, supervision and training.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
