## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands local safeguarding procedures. She has detailed policies in place, which outline the steps to follow should she be concerned about the welfare of a child. She is aware of the importance of completing risk assessments and how to minimise hazards in the environment.
- The childminder knows how children learn. She knows how to complete regular observations and assessments of children's learning and share these with parents. The childminder recognises the importance of gathering information from parents about their children's starting points, interests and care needs.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's well-being. She knows how to encourage good behaviour. She understands the value of helping children to feel good about themselves and to learn to respect others.
- The childminder takes positive steps to continually develop her skills and knowledge. For example, she attends local authority training and shares good practice ideas with other childminders.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

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#### **Inspection activities**

■ The inspector held discussions with the childminder to assess how she intends to meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage.

- The inspector had a tour of the premises with the childminder and viewed the toys and equipment available for children.
- The inspector sampled a range of relevant documentation that the childminder intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her systems for self-evaluation.
